# Leeds Beckett University Welcomes You CHME Conference 2024








## **Conference Venue**

There will also be a quiet space available in CSS 116 – this is a small meeting room to the right of the Boardroom (CSS 115).


For delegates who want some fresh air and outside space, the campus is located in Beckett Park, where there are a number of walks to enjoy: Beckett Park | Discover Leeds.







# **Hotels**

For delegates staying at The Village or at Weetwood Hall, there are a number of bus services from the City Centre to both hotels. Both hotels are a









# **Getting to the Campus from Your Hotel**

All hotels are a five minute taxi drive or 25 minute (approx.) walk to the campus.


