- Postgraduate secondary 11-18 with QTS students for Art and Design, English, Geography, Maths and Physical Education who follow a one-year full time course

MENTORS

MENTOR TRAINING

Mentor training takes place during live sessions via Microsoft Teams and self-directed training via our online learning platform. The training is designed to meet the needs of, and develop, new mentors as well as those returning to work with us. The upcoming dates for live mentor training sessions via Microsoft Teams are Wednesday 11th October 4-6pm for Primary Mentors and Thursday 12th October 4-6pm for Secondary Mentors.

PEBBLEPAD

We have been hard at work over summer taking on board the ideas and feedback about PebblePad, our student e-portfolio workbook for placement assessment and learning. Changes have been made to make PebblePad more user-friendly and increase its use and completion. Mentors will be receiving training on the use of PebblePad, be shown the changes, and further to this be sent PebblePad guides and videos.

CALLING ALL MENTORS

We are conducting a research project across England, Scotland and Wales to understand the factors that influence us when observing student teachers' lessons. Through this research, we want to develop an in-depth understanding of how to develop mentor training and policy around teacher education. There are three stages to the research:

- 1. Watch a recorded lesson and complete a questionnaire.
- 2. Take part in an online focus group (you do not need to take part in this stage if you only want to contribute to stage 1).
- 3. Take part in a focus panel (you do not need to take part in this stage if you only want to contribute to stage 1 or 2).

Your contribution to this research will be invaluable in developing a deeper understanding of a vital stage of teacher education; the role of a mentor. All information collected through the research will be anonymous and confidential.
