






Conference Venue

There will also be a quiet space available in CSS 116 – this is a small meeting room to the right of the Boardroom (CSS 115).



Locations in the City Centre









Hotels

For delegates staying at The Village or at Weetwood Hall, there are a number of bus services from the City Centre to both hotels.


Premier Inn, Headingley









Getting to the Campus from Your Hotel

All hotels are a five minute taxi drive or 25 minute (approx.) walk to the campus.


