### **Mentor Training Modules**

### 1. Essential mentor training:

This covers the essential information needed by mentors (primary and secondary) to support Leeds Beckett students and includes:

- Key dates
- Roles and responsibilities
- Assessment
- The mentor role
- Week by week guide to placement
- Planning
- Intervention

### 2. How to make the most of your weekly meeting:

#### This includes:

- · Aims of a weekly meeting
- Reviewing progress
- Setting good targets
- Observations
- Recording the weekly meeting

## 3. Understanding the mentor role:

#### This includes:

- Understanding the mentor role: including pedagogy and effective relationships
- The Leeds Beckett student curriculum: including Rosenshine's principles, CCF, our student pathway, our student attributes.
- Assessment
- Subject knowledge development

### 4. Developing working relationships with students

- ONSIDE mentoring: exploring the research base on effective mentoring.
- Intervention and student support: when to intervene, how to intervene, effective support plans, outcomes of intervention.

# 5. Placement Development meeting

This is a meeting for a group of mentors to review evidence from student placements and contribute to placement development. This includes:

- Discussion and review of end placement data.
- Placement development, considering evidence, mentoring, the ITE curriculum and subject knowledge, and intensive training and practice (ITaP).

#### 6. Placement Reviews

This will be a video for mentors describing in detail the processes for progress and final placement review, including the role of mentors, students and link tutors.

# 7. Establishing effective working relationships which are collaborative and purposeful. This includes:

- A seminar based around research and experiential data on building strong relationships with students, how to encourage resilience, proactivity and a sense of professional ownership in students.
- A presentation on developing anti-racist mentoring.

## 8. Effective observation and feedback

This is a seminar exploring research evidence on what makes effective observation and feedback for students and strategies for promoting student development.

# 9. Subject-specific support and development

This is a summer conference with subject phase leads aimed at supporting and extending mentors' knowledge of subject specific research to foster a deep shared understanding of each area of the curriculum and associated pedagogies. This will include a viewing students' lessons considering assessment outcomes and approaches.
